You may also wish to access support from the <u>local sexual assault referral</u> <u>centre (SARC)</u> who will consider your physical and emotional health needs, this may include a forensic exam, if you are unsure about whether to report to the police, they can support through the process.

Alternatively, if you have decided that you do not wish to report to the police you can access support on Campus from <u>Living Without Abuse</u>, who can assist you in accessing the local sexual health clinic and provide emotional support.

If the perpetrator is another member of the university community you can also report the incident to University Security on 01509 222141, should you wish to discuss what support is available from the university you can book an appointment here. This appointment with a DAI adviser would consider options to help you feel safe.
